Notice is hereby given that the City of Phenix City wishes to implement an *Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Program (IDDE)* as required by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) in order to maintain the City of Phenix City's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit.

The proposed plan has been developed to ensure that pollutants originating from industrial, commercial, residential or urban developments do not enter into the City of Phenix City's Storm Sewer System (MS4) or the Waters of the State.

A PUBLIC HEARING on the matter will be conducted during the regularly scheduled council meeting set for 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, February 7, 2017 in the Council Chambers located within the Public Safety Building at 1111 Broad Street, Phenix City, Alabama 36867. Said hearing shall be open to the public. All interested parties are encouraged to attend.
