#### 2017 MAYOR'S BALL FOR EDUCATION AND CHARITY AWARDS CEREMONY

Mayor Eddie Lowe, members of the Phenix City Council and the Mayor's Ball Committee Members are pleased to announce the recipients of the Fourth Annual Mayor's Ball for Education and Charity.

A reception will be held at 6:00 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday, July 24, 2017 at the Martin-Idle Hour Park Community Center, Max Wilkes Fellowship Hall, 3743 Moon Lake Drive, Phenix City, Alabama.

The 2017 Mayor's Ball was the fourth ball for Mayor Eddie Lowe and the Mayor's Ball Committee Members. The event hosted over 700 people and raised in excess of \$100,000. The four year total for funds raised for the Phenix City Community is slightly over \$300,000. Each year support from the community grows as more people attend the ball, and provide donations.

Previously, the awards have been given during regularly scheduled Phenix City Council Meetings. This year, however, the Mayor's Ball Committee Members decided to hold a ceremony for the recipients outside of a council meeting to accommodate the group of recipients. Thirty four (34) students will be receiving college scholarships along with 11 local Non-Profit Agencies serving the Phenix City area from the proceeds of the 2017 Mayor's Ball.

Including the 2017 recipients, the Mayor's Ball for Education and Charity has provided 90 students with college scholarships, and 25 local non-profit agencies with additional funds. (Dual Enrollment awards will be awarded in January 2018.)

Attached is a list of the students and non-profit agencies being honored at the reception.
