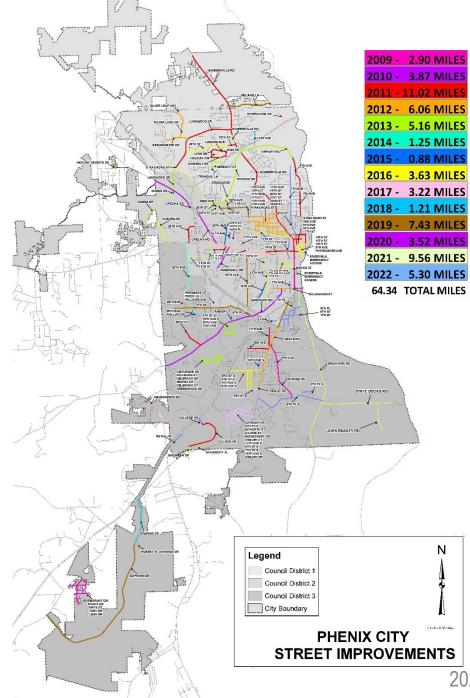

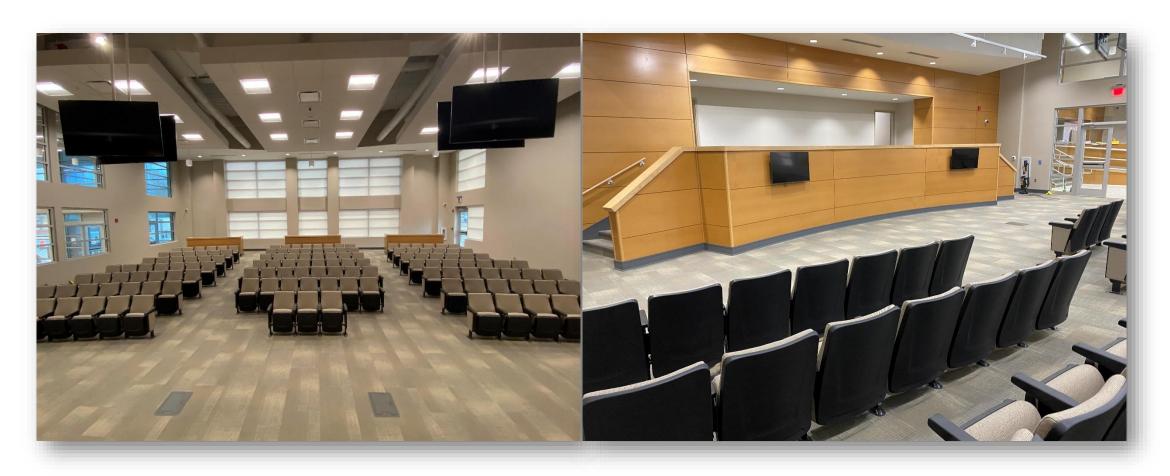
Public Safety Building Expansion/Renovation

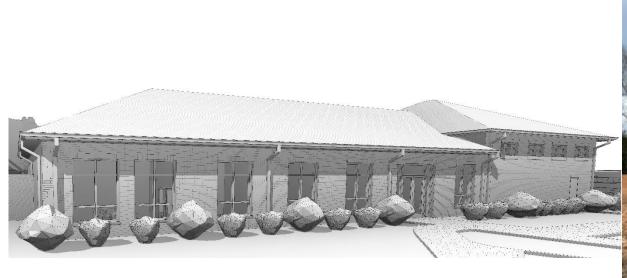

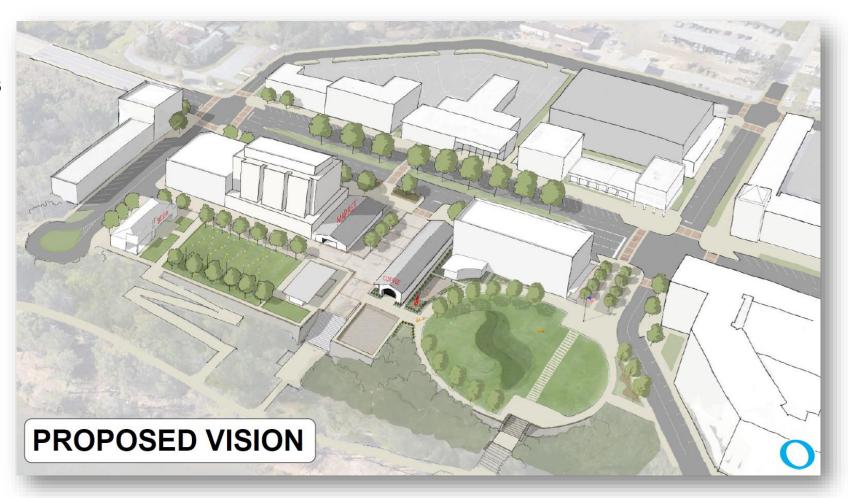
Riverfront Development

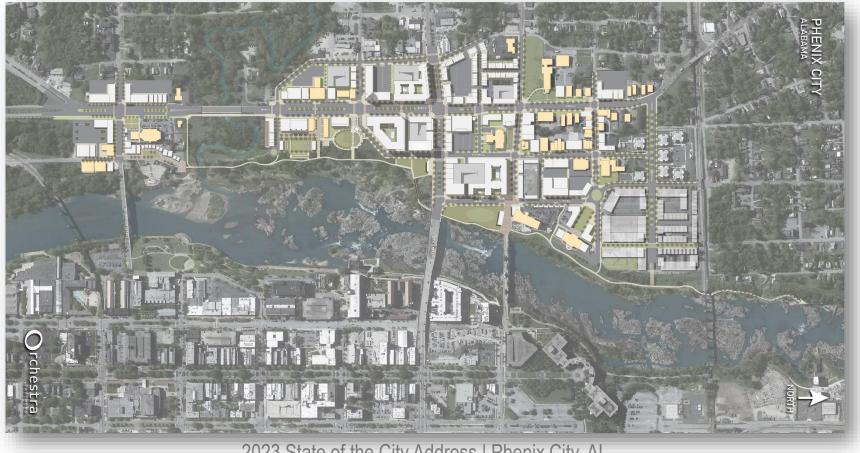
